FOREWORD

SINCE THE Higher Education General Information Survey package was first assembled from disparate periodic survey forms of the Office of Education in 1966, it has been apparent to the National Center for Educational Statistics and to the higher education community that the various lists of higher education instructional programs in the HEGIS packages needed to be revised to bring them in line with the best current practice and to make them consistent with each other. This publication responds to that need.

The taxonomy of instructional programs will be used in the HEGIS surveys of 1971-72, and all subsequent surveys whenever the data are acquired on the basis of instructional programs. This will include the future surveys of earned degrees and other formal awards, enrollment for advanced degrees, upper division enrollment by major, field of training of faculty, instructional program assignments of faculty, expenditures by instructional program, etc. Because the translation of current records on physical plant space presents some unusual difficulties, present plans contemplate no survey of the allocation of physical plant space by instructional program again until the fall term of 1974.

This taxonomy represents an effort to prescribe not how instructional programs should be organized but how the majority of institutions of higher education actually do organize and record data on instructional programs. At the same time, it attempts to reflect categories for which data are needed. Every institution, association, and professional organization in higher education was asked to assist in the development of this taxonomy, and every comment and suggestion was reviewed and evaluated.

In another form, this taxonomy has been adopted as the core portion of the Program Classification Structure developed by the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education's Management Information Systems Program (WICHE-MIS), and will be essential for use of the WICHE-MIS standard models and cost exchange procedures.

The present report is being published far in advance of its first prospective use in 1971-72 in order to provide a maximum lead time for any change of institutional records deemed necessary. According to current plans, this taxonomy will not be modified in any major way (apart from the addition of new instructional programs) during the ensuing 5-year period in order that institutions and other agencies may receive a maximum return from the time and effort expended in the construction or modification of file systems. The continued provision of criticism and comment is encouraged both to assist us in minor modifications and to help us prepare for eventual major revision.

INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

MANY MEMBERS of the higher education community have recommended modification and updating of the list of discipline specialties in the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS) questionnaires. Moreover, they have urged that the list be made sufficiently flexible and comprehensive for adaptation to overall institutional recordkeeping, apart from HEGIS reporting. This revision—incorporating the suggestions—has the following specific objectives:

- 1. To produce a list of instructional programs that would be equally applicable to HEGIS data on students, faculty assignments, finance, and space.
- 2. To reflect as accurately as possible the instructional programs and curriculums now in existence or likely to appear in the future.
- To build enough comprehensiveness and flexibility into the list so that it may remain relatively stable.
- 4. To construct a list which is acceptable and practical for general institutional recordkeeping, for management information systems, and for program budget structure employed by higher education institutions.
- To provide a system for translating records based on old coding procedures (e.g., the Higher Education Facilities Classification) into the new specialty list.

The standard list of instructional programs presented in this publication was developed cooperatively by the National Center for Educational Statistics and the National Center for Educational Research and Development (both of the Office of Education), and the Western Interstate Commission on Higher Education.

A crucial feature in the development of the standard list was a comprehensive review process involving all sectors of the higher education community—Federal agencies concerned with statistical data on higher education, institutions of higher education, and higher education associations and organizations. The review process began in the spring of 1969 when a preliminary draft of the list was circulated to a number of persons in the higher education community; in addition, field

visits were made to a sample of institutions for discussion of the list. Comments generated by the first review cycle provided a basis for a revision that was developed by a committee made up of representatives of the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers, the American Council on Education, and the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States, together with representatives of the Office of Education and the Western Interstate Commission. The resulting draft was then sent to Federal agencies, to education associations and organizations, and to all institutions of higher education. The final version presented here reflects not only comments volunteered by the numerous reviewers but also the outcome of a series of meetings with representatives of other Federal agencies.

After the standard list itself had been developed, the final step was to construct the index and the translation tables. The translation tables show the relationship of the new system to the systems used in the HEGIS Earned Degree survey, the Higher Education Facilities Classification, the Vocational Education and Occupations classification systems, and the U.S. Bureau of the Budget Standard Classification of Fields of Science and Engineering.

A VIEW OF THE INSTITUTIONAL REPORTING TASK

No centrally prepared list can precisely match the pattern of discipline titles and content within all institutions. Despite institutional variations, the new list is designed to contain a definite place for *every* specialization needed for classifying students, faculty assignments, finance, and facilities. To the extent that the list attains this objective, institutions may also find it useful for their own records systems even though it is not a "perfect fit."

Each institution, then, will interpret its own programs in terms of the new HEGIS list and translate its own titles into HEGIS terminology. For example, what one college calls "biostatistics" may be judged comparable to "biometrics" on the HEGIS list. Some institutions may find it convenient to record their own discipline codes next to the HEGIS codes in the index.

Once the proper reporting category has been decided for each degree program that an institution offers, the preparation of HEGIS reports should be quite simple. For example, each student's major field, each faculty member's teaching assignments, and each space allocation could be coded according to the discipline specialization list and the codes stored in the institution's regular data file. Then, by a fairly routine clerical operation (or a simple computer program), HEGIS and other reports could be compiled from institutional files. If an institution has kept its records in accordance with the old HEGIS codes (or with one of the other systems covered by the translation tables), conversion to the new system should be quite straightforward.

It should be recognized that a particular faculty member, student, or facility may require several codes for complete identification. For example, a faculty member may have a series of degrees, each in a different field; he may be assigned by the institution to work in some other field; and he may consider that his primary research competence is in still another field.

In attempting to use the new HEGIS list, the user is urged to "browse" through the entire list to see how the discipline specialties have been ordered. Such browsing will serve at least two purposes: first, to identify substantial portions of the list that may be ignored by a particular college and, second, to avoid classifying a program into a semiappropriate category near the start of the list when there is a more appropriate category further along.

THE DISCIPLINE CLASSIFICATION

The new HEGIS classification is divided into two main sections. Section I deals with conventional academic subdivisions of knowledge and training; section II, with technologies and occupation specialties related to curriculums leading to associate degrees and other awards below the baccalaureate.

Within the two sections, each discipline *division* is shown in bold type at the beginning of each specialty list, along with a brief definition. Under the discipline division are listed the discipline *specialties*. It should be noted that the discipline specialty list is not intended to be a list of individual courses.

Inevitably, the decision that certain specialties belong under one division rather than another is somewhat arbitrary; some users will disagree with certain classifications. For example, one institution may classify botany under agriculture and another may classify it under biological sciences; economics may be classified under business and commerce or under social studies. The important point is that data can be reported in the appropriate, specific category. The user who wishes to aggregate in a manner other than that implied by the HEGIS discipline division may then do so.

The first title under most of the discipline divisions is listed as a *general* category. This is intended to provide some flexibility in the reporting scheme and should be useful for broad programs that encompass several of the listed specialties.

When attempting to classify an individual or a facility which does not seem to fit into the list, the institution has two choices: (1) it can be listed by name under "other" if it seems to represent an unlisted specialty, or (2) it can be placed in the "general" category if it seems to cover several listed specialties. Such fine points must be decided at the institutional level, but it is hoped that the index is comprehensive enough to minimize the need for such decisions.

THE INDEX

To satisfy the many purposes for which the taxonomy is intended, it must be very lengthy and diverse. To make it easier to use, it is followed by two alphabetical indexes of program titles—including a number of related titles not appearing in the discipline classification—showing the discipline category in which the item should be placed. The first index applies to the conventional academic subdivisions of knowledge; the second, to technologies and other occupational specialties related to curriculums leading to associate degrees and other awards below the baccalaureate.

THE TRANSLATION TABLES

The tables on pages 21–32 of this publication provide a means for translating into the new coding system from:

- The list of academic specialties used in the HEGIS survey of degrees awarded in 1968-69. Essentially the same list was used in the HEGIS survey of Students Enrolled for Advanced Degrees.
- 2. The Standard Classification of Organizational Units and Subject Fields, from the Higher Edu-

- 3. The list of technical education programs from *Vocational Education and Occupations*, published by the U.S. Office of Education and the U.S. Department of Labor, Manpower Administration.
- 4. The U.S. Bureau of the Budget Circular A-46, Standard Classification of Fields of Science and Engineering.

In reviewing the translation tables, it will be noted that the new list provides coverage of all specialties included in the four documents cited above. In many instances, the new list provides for much greater specificity of reporting than the old systems. For example, the HEGIS Earned Degree list uses a single code (7710) for area studies; by comparison, area studies involves 15 different codes in the new list, with separate codes for East Asiatic studies, Islamic studies, Russian and other Slavic studies, and so forth. Similarly, BOB Circular A-46 provides only a single code for chemistry as compared with five in the new list (organic chemistry, physical chemistry, general chemistry, and so forth).

CODING

It will be noted that, within the discipline divisions, the lists of discipline specialties have been arranged without strict adherence to alphabetical or other logical sequence. This is done purposely: any additions to the lists during the next few years can be made without disturbing the coding sequence or the rationale of the listing arrangement. Furthermore, this system purposely avoids arbitrary organizations of fields into questionable and potentially controversial hierarchies of subfields and sub-subfields within a discipline division. Thus, avoidance of a logical sequence for the discipline specialty lists is deemed desirable and actually becomes the rationale for the arrangement.

A block coding scheme has been used in this taxonomy. The first two digits of the four-digit code identify the discipline division. Numbers 01 through 49 are used for identification of the conventional academic fields of section I. Numbers 50 and above are used as the first two code digits to identify the technologies and vocational specialties of section II. Under all discipline divisions, the last two digits of the code are used to identify the specialties.
